PACERS AND TROTTERS

Unlike thoroughbreds who are bred for speed and to run as fast as they can, standardbreds (pacers & trotters) must stay on their specific gait—the trot/pace.

Think of it in swimming terms—thoroughbreds are the free-style swimmers and standardbreds are the breast-stroke or back-stroke swimmers—still trying to go fast but also remain on gait.

Trotting is the natural and more difficult gait. Trotters have a diagonal gait—front left leg and rear right leg go forward at the same time and then the front right with rear left.

Pacers are often called side-wheelers because pacers' legs on each side go forward together—right-side forward and the left-side forward.

Trotters usually go a few seconds slower than pacers.

PARKED OUT COMPUTATIONS

The extra distance a horse travels when forced to race outside of other horses (parked): 1/2 mile track—(4 turns) - 63 ft; 5/8 mile track—(3 turns) - 47 ft; 7/8 or 1 mile track—(2 turns) - 31 ft.

SADDLEPADS OR RACING COLORS

The saddlepads worn by horses have two numbers, a large number

(their post position) and a smaller number which indicates the horse's race number. The saddlepad color of each horse will match the color above his program number in the program. In a race with a mutual entry, the horses that comprise the entry may wear 1 and 1A saddlepads denoting they have common ownership.

UNIVERSAL DRIVER RATING SYSTEM

Method used for comparing past performances of drivers and trainers. The UDRS is comparable to a baseball batting average. The UDRS average is derived from the following point system: Wins are multiplied by 9, seconds by 5, and thirds by 3. These numbers are added together and the total is divided by the numbers of starts multiplied by 9.

HORSE CLASSIFICATION

Conditioned—Horses grouped by certain conditions published by the Race Secretary. These conditions always include gait and may include age, sex earnings or number of races won.

Claiming Races—Horses grouped by value and entered by owner at the price they feel best suits the horse. **Claiming Handicap**—Example: \$10,000—\$12,500 claiming handicap—the \$12,500 claiming horses draw outside of the \$10,000 claimers, thus are handicapped.

Optional Claiming—A horse may enter a conditioned race because there is an optional claiming price on the conditioned race. For example,

SCRATCH REASONS

IJ - Injured
JG - Judges
LM - Lame
SK - Sick

a non-winners \$5,000 last 5 starts conditioned race may have an optional claiming price of \$20,000. The horse entered may not fit the condition of the race but enters his horse via the claiming price, where he is eligible to be claimed.

Stakes Races—Owners pay (stake) fees the prior year or supplement the same year. The owner's money is added to the purse along with money added by the racetrack.

Early/Late Closing Events—Horses are nominated (pay a nominating fee) at least 6 weeks prior (Early Closer) or within 6 weeks (Late Closer) to the racing of the event.

Qualifying Races—Qualifiers are just that, horses have to meet certain standards (qualify) to race. These standards may include staying on gait (not breaking stride) and/or racing within a certain time standard for their age and gait.
